

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK THE GHOST OF JACOB MARLEY

Anyone that has come into my office and looked on my desk has seen this strange little statue of Jacob Marley from Charles Dickens, "A Christmas Carol." I have even had people ask me why it is there because they found it odd that a pastor who has preached against the existence of ghosts would have a statue of one on his desk. I figured it being December and close to Christmas I would explain this seemingly strange phenomenon.

Around 2002, my family and I attended a church that loved to perform dramas. The drama director convinced me that I should play Jacob Marley in their upcoming production. I was a little hesitant but later agreed and wasn't sorry because it was such a joy to get involved in this way. If I remember right, there were 80 people involved in the production. This drama was so successful in bringing our neighbors to the church that we continued to offer it every Christmas. Two years later I had the most challenging year of my life as my grandmother, mother, and father passed within 4 months of each other (dad passed around 5am on Christmas Eve). My family and I gathered as usual on Christmas Eve, but it wasn't the same. As a matter of fact, I don't remember much about Christmas day or any day into January. We were so numbed by grief that we didn't attend church for quite a while. It was probably the end of January before we started attending again and the first Sunday back one of the teenagers that also acted in the drama gave me a Christmas gift. Actually, she'd been wanting to give it to me for a while and was patient enough to wait for us to return. I opened it and to my surprise it was a statue of Jacob Marley...the very one that sits on my desk. I started laughing when I saw it. I realized then that it was the first time I laughed in a very long time and it felt good. As

with us. Even in the darkest of times, there is always the light of Christ that shines through the darkness. That statue will sit on my desk and I will tell that story to anyone that asks.

Now, I realize that Jacob Marley is merely a fictional character, but sometimes we need something tangible to remind us of something positive in our lives especially when things are not going well (that is usually around the holidays). It might be depression, family conflict, family that wrote you off all of the sudden calls you, or many other things. And this is where that wonderful manger scene shines brightly and reminds us of the love of God that is ALWAYS with us no matter what.

I am writing this two days before
Thanksgiving and we have yet to put our manger scene under our tree. Even though mine is still in its box, I know exactly how each piece is supposed to be placed. You have Joseph and Mary in the manger while the shepherds, wise men, and the animal set up outside of the manger. I usually try and put them in the same place, but I can't always do that. The most important thing about the little figurines is that their eyes are focused on the little baby in the middle...their eyes are focused on the true reason for the season...the Messiah come to earth. Emmanuel!! God with us!!

I hope this Christmas season and beyond that we keep these little reminders around to know that there is more than hope, but an eternal hope that is with us during our lives on this earth and we are assured by that same hope that there is forever after. It might be a manger scene, it might be a picture on your walls, or it might be a cross that you wear every day. May they remind you of the peace that surpasses all human understanding that keeps your hearts in

COMMUNION SERVICES FOR DECEMBER



TRUSTEES' REPORT

NOVEMBER 13, 2023

Items Previously Discussed or Completed

The Church boiler was cleaned and inspected by Hawn Heating on October 25th. This was done under a contract that the Church maintains with Hawn. Subsequent to this service, on Sunday, November 5th, the boiler stopped working and the Church was cold when people arrived for the first service. Hawn immediately responded to an emergency call and restarted the unit. There was initially a service charge but Hawn subsequently informed me that they were reimbursing the \$200 dollar charge to the Church credit card.

Other Items

- As a reminder, a contract for snow plowing has been renewed with Cedar Creek Lawn Care. Snow plowing will be done November 1st of 2023 through March 31st 2024. Plowing will be done when snow accumulations reach 2 inches. The property is to be cleared by 7 am.
- The Church lift (elevator) was inspected on November 9th by a representative from NEIS (National Elevator Inspection Service). No problems were identified.
- The Church boiler will be inspected by a representative of HSB (The Hartford Steam Boiler Inspection and Insurance Company) on December 12th. This inspection is schedule to occur after 12 noon. It is my understanding that this is required under our insurance and is done every 2 years. Separately, a state inspector will be inspecting our boiler early next year but I do not have a date for that inspection.
