FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK WHY DO I <u>DO</u> WHAT I <u>DON'T</u> WANT TO DO?

This is the Apostle Paul's struggle that he writes in Romans 7:15-20. It not only is Paul's confession to the church at Rome but is something we can all relate to. We are all tempted to do the very things we don't want to...the very things we hate. It is the "little" sin that we deceive ourselves into thinking won't matter. It also might be the sin that everyone around us witnessed that causes them to look at us differently. Paul writes the reason in vs. 18, "For I have the desire to do what is right, but not the ability to carry it out." As much as we try (and yes we try constantly) we find that we cannot go it alone. We need help!

Truth is we cannot stop a bad habit. We can only replace it with a good one. The good one is the one that Jesus calls us to do in this life: pursue holiness (1 Peter 1:15). There are two lessons that stick out the most. One, sin subtly creeps into our lives. Two, while we love quick fixes, pursuing holiness is a lifelong pursuit full of micro-decisions along the way.

This will be our next sermon series beginning on Ash Wednesday (Feb 14th) and will run through the beginning of Holy week. Each Sunday morning and Wednesday evening we will explore the battles that we encounter: Pride & Humility, Anger & Forgiveness, "Cynicism & Optimism," and others. We will also dive deep into Scripture and what it means to pursue a holy life. One that is constantly in those battles and yet depends fully on Christ Jesus.

SPENCERPORT ECUMENICAL FOOD SHELF

The Board of the SEFS is made up of two representatives from each area church and two at large members. We met at the Wesleyan Church on Jan 8, 2024. Two notable things happened at that Board Meeting. First, our long time Treasurer, Dick Gallagher retired. Thank you, Dick, for all those years of service! COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES

JANUARY 8, 2024

Members present: Cathy DeConinck, Lisa Castricone, Kim Rivers, Eileen Bruton, Rodney Boatman, and Pastor Steve

Meeting opened 7:04 PM with prayer by Eileen. No Minutes from previous meeting to approve.

Treasurer Report: none

Financial Report: L. Castricone – Envelope numbers/report matches the bank statement, but no treasurer's report to match, at this time.

Bd. Of Christian Outreach: K Rivers – Carols and Cookies was a fun event, in December with 2 non-member families attending.

Pastor's Report: It's the beginning of year 3 and time "To Do". Leadership team will begin to create a schedule for the year's planned events and communicate this to the congregation. Need to focus outward, and step up efforts with the preschool.

Elders Report: Eileen Bruton

The 7:00 PM Christmas service was discussed. There were many positive comments made by Elders and others in attendance. The video on screen and the song "Believe" were great.

The center speaker in the sanctuary needs to be replaced, Evan has taken care of the replacement. Professionals will be hired to do the work. Scaffolding will most likely be used. The sound board also needs work and additional operators will be needed.

Ash Wednesday falls on February 14th. A communion service will be held at 7 PM, 2 Elder's will be needed. Mid-week Lenten services will be held as usual, but attendance will be monitored to determine whether these services will be continued in the future.

Pastor has recently visited Janet Cronin and has placed her on our home bound list. Bill and Cathy Craw are not doing well, Cathy's memory has become quite poor. Tom Troxell no longer recognizes his surroundings.

Trustees (Building Maintenance Team): R Boatman:

- The Church boiler was inspected by a representative of HSB (The Hartford Steam Boiler Inspection and Insurance Company) on December 12th. There were no problems found.
- A broken stair tread on the stairs leading down from the Sanctuary to the Mary Martha Hall (North end of Church) was repaired on December 16th. Thank you to my team, Mark Gebhardt and Ron Lillie, who did the majority of the work on this project.
- The town Fire Marshall, Rich McQuilkin, inspected the Church on December 19th. The only problems identified were the emergency lights over the Sanctuary (north end doors) and over the north end door of the Mary Martha Hall. These lights come on with backup battery power when the electricity is off. The batteries in these units were replaced.
- Gatti Plumbing was at the Church on Thursday, December 14th to descale the iron pipe sewer line running from the Church to the road. A bid from Gatti Plumbing had been obtained several months earlier. The work entailed first removing a toilet from the women's bathroom to gain access to the pipe. The 50' from this access point to the exit point of the pipe from the Church was descaled and checked with a camera.
- We need to work on priorities of what we need to do and when, and how to pay for it.

Things to Consider for the Future:

The Trustees suggest that the Council begin to discuss funding priorities for future repairs and remodeling at the Church. Items such as painting, flooring replacements and parking lot repairs are among things still on the list and that will need attention at some time in the future.
