FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK EVER WONDER WHAT YOUR PASTOR PRAYS FOR?

I have mentioned that God answers prayer in Bible study. I have preached about prayer more than a few times. On Sundays, I pray before bible study and pray at least once during our service. How about when I am alone in my office at 6am? What do I pray for while I am riding my bicycle? (No, I don't close my eyes while riding!!) I pray for you!! But what do I ask for? What is it that your pastor continuously asks for when turning to prayer? I wanted to share this with you in my message because I think it is important to know how much I care about you and our church and yes even our neighbors. Here are my most common prayers:

1) That our congregation know each other well (very well!!)

It's one thing to know people you are related to, but how about those who you are not related to and are part of the congregation? My prayer is that we do.

2) That our congregation walk together in faith.
This goes along with #1. One of the most difficult times for any one member is when they go through a crisis. My prayer is that when something happens to someone, we do all we can as a congregation to help them through whatever it is.
3) To be more selfless (Part 1).

Many church bodies have created a false narrative that I can have an individual relationship with Jesus without being a part of the body of Christ. That, in itself, can turn into a me, myself, and I attitude toward faith and church. To expound on one of Jesus parables, we are not individual sheep in a sheep pen, but rather we are a flock that are gathered by the Shepherd. We are created to be together. Certainly church is a vital part of our walk of faith and my prayer is that more of us are reminded of that very fact.

4) To be more selfless (part 2)

I go to church, I tithe, I pray, AND I am a good person. Don't get me wrong, these are all great attributes of a Christian. The problem is this list is incomplete. Jesus teaches us His condensed version of the commandments. Love the Lord vour God with all vour heart, mind, and soul AND love your neighbor as yourself. My life as a Christian is not about myself, but about others. My prayer is that we do as our Lord did in the upper room and wash the feet (aka serve others) of others...placing their needs before our own. 5) Know the Word, and teach it to others This is the prayer I say after every Bible study session. Bible study is not only for those who come, but for our circle of influence. Whether that be our family members, friends, or neighbors...everyone who needs to hear the Word.

You see, those of you who are mature Christians...that have read Scripture and have attended for many years know your Lord Jesus. You know that He died for you and offers forgiveness of you sins as we repent. This is why my prayers are not about knowing Jesus, but rather following Him into neighborhood because they need us. There you go!! It shouldn't surprise you because you have probably heard these petitions in a sermon (or two). Don't get me wrong, I do pray for those who are sick, are homebound, or are troubled, but as far as the church is concerned these are the very things that cross my mind often. I pray them out of love and a desire to see this church become a beacon of light...the light of Christ to our community as it should be. Amen!
