If they are parents themselves, then attempting to work around their own children's schedule. They are excited and already tired. And I'm sure the teachers that are reading this article find it difficult not to correct their pastor's errors. For the most part, it is a thankless job. That is until now.

# TRUSTEES' REPORT SEPTEMBER 19, 2023

An emergency door locking mechanism has been installed on the double doors from the Mary Martha Hall. Also, a simple bolt lock for the single door at the North end of the Mary Martha Hall has also been installed. The bolt lock is unlocked with the current Church key that fits all other doors. Thank you to Evan Hart for your assistance with these installations. As requested, a large metal shelf was removed from the storage room at the north end of the Mary Martha Hall.

### Miscellaneous:

The Church lawn was treated by TruGreen on August 21st. This was the second of two treatments this year at a total cost of \$526.24.

### Other Considerations:

- A fall cleanup was recommended at the recent Council meeting.
- Descaling of the Church's sewer pipe was also discussed at the meeting. One estimate of the cost from Gatti Plumbing in 2022 was \$2,000 to \$3,000 and would involve a device put down the line and would not require digging up of the pipe in the yard. If funds are available, it is highly recommended that we get this done to avoid any future floods downstairs.
