

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

CHURCH DISCIPLINE AND MATTHEW 18:21-22

Matthew 18:21-22, "Then Peter came up and said to him, "Lord, how often will my brother sin against me, and I forgive him? As many as seven time? Jesus said to him, "I do not say to you seven times, but seventy times seven."

These verses are the reason many believe that the church/individual Christians should always forgive no matter the circumstance. It is also the verses that cause people to suggest that the church has no right to discipline anyone within the congregation no matter the circumstances. It's a struggle to say the least. However, there's something missing when we suggest that forgiveness should always be given no matter the circumstance. Forgiveness is given to those who repent. If you look at the section just before these verses (Matthew 18:15-20) Jesus lays out what church discipline looks like in that the one accused has plenty of opportunity to hear what they've done in order for them to repent. If that doesn't happen, it is clear in vs. 17b, "And if he refuses to listen even to the church let him be to you as a Gentile and a tax collector."

Let's understand repentance. Simply it is turning away from transgressions or actions that are basically "unchristian." More important, it is a change in attitude and actions. A couple of weeks ago, I made a mistake in one of my sermons. Once I realized what I had done. I made sure the next week that I communicated it to the congregation, corrected the error, and asked for forgiveness. I make sure each week in my prep time that this doesn't happen again. Will it happen again? It could, but I hope not. Notice, I have made changes so that the chances that it happens again would be rare. That's repentance. It is also the reason Jesus teaches that we are to offer limitless forgiveness is because no one is perfect and relapses can occur. Can we offer forgiveness to someone that is unrepentant?

Instead of going before the congregation to admit that I erred, I keep doing the same thing over and over again. Even after the Elders talked to me, I continue to do the same thing. Is there forgiveness? No. That's what is referred to as "cheap grace and is unbiblical."

What if the person(s) remain unrepentant? An even more difficult situation is this. What if we are talking about long-term unrepentance where there have been countless times over many years when someone claims to be sorry, asks for forgiveness, but there is no change in attitude or actions? This is where the verses I mentioned a couple of weeks ago apply. One that I will mention in this article is Titus 3:10, "As for a person that stirs up division, after warning him once and then twice, having nothing to do with him, knowing that such a person is warped and sinful; his is self-condemned." Unrepentance means they are condemning themselves and yes, forgiveness is withheld.

That's where the church is mandated by Scripture to act. It is not out of anger or spite, but is to protect the flock from what may be an antagonist or possibly a false teacher/prophet. Someone who is purposely causing divisions, chaos, and causing people to leave. It is unacceptable behavior and the church must act. Again, it's not easy and yet it is necessary for the sake of the flock.

Hopefully, this helps you see that the church is here for the broken and the lost in order for the Gospel to "fix" them. The church is also here to protect the flock from those who might want to see it divided...a place of chaos instead of a place of peace. Amen!



TRUSTEES' REPORT AUGUST 14, 2023

A number of items from the last council meeting are still to be completed. Additional bush removal/trimming along the side windows of the Mary Martha Hall has not been done and my attempts to get consensus on a date/time have not been successful. I am formally turning this over to others to arrange for the organization and follow-through. I have purchased an emergency door locking mechanism to be installed on the double doors from the Mary Martha Hall but this is yet to be installed (cost \$102.37, see below). Also, a simple bolt lock for the single door at the North end of the Mary Martha Hall has been proposed (to be purchased).

Miscellaneous:

Lettering for the placards on the Church sign was purchased online from Lettering.com. The correct times for "Traditional" and "Contemporary" are now displayed. The cost was \$71.21 for the lettering. On 7/31/2023 the New York DEC sent an inspector to check our property for Giant Hogweed. Plants found were treated with an herbicide. All control work for the year has been completed.
